



## About the Christian Science Nursing Arts curriculum

The Christian Science Nursing Arts (CSNA) Training Program supports dedicated members of The Mother Church who are preparing to represent themselves as a Christian Science nurse. The training addresses preparation for and securing a practice in this spiritual ministry that meets the standard and requirements of the *Church Manual* By-law "Christian Science Nurse," and demonstrates the expression of the qualities of the nurse that Mary Baker Eddy specifies (*Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures*, pg. 395).

The time it takes to complete CSNA training is individual according to each one's demonstrated practice in the art of Christian Science nursing and readiness for the next course level. The BA offers mentored instruction and benefits that support classroom training. Subsidized housing is available for individuals enrolled in the training.

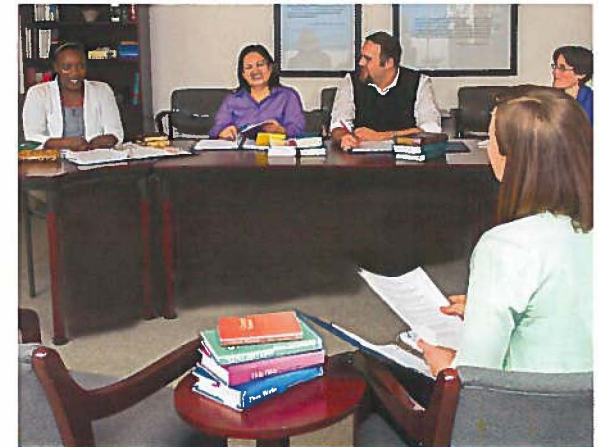

## Ministering to mankind with Christian Science nursing

*If you have a deep desire to help others in a spiritually fulfilling healing ministry, then Christian Science nursing may be your calling.*

Ministering to one another in Christian Science nursing requires a deep understanding and devotion to the healing mission of our Church. It requires having a “demonstrable knowledge of Christian Science practice” (*Church Manual*, p. 49). It springs from our love for God and a clear understanding of His love for His children—and reflecting this love. Christian Science

nursing turns us away from material sense testimony without turning us away from our fellow man. Ministering with the art of Christian Science nursing ensures a standard of excellence in care that is safe, dignified, tender, unobtrusive, and in perfect accord with the theology of Christian Science.

As you cultivate these arts in the training program, you will find it to be divinely natural to witness healing before, or in the midst of, giving care. Christian Science nursing is a natural result of our confidence in God’s love for His creation.
